Marinus Koning, ReachAnother founder, said: "Good tools are half the work and we were told stories by newly graduated neurosurgeons at medical centers in Ethiopia that they could not perform surgery at all because of a lack of instruments. They were moved to tears when we gave them a set of just 20, because it made it possible for them to start applying their skills with patients. When we heard about the new European regulations, we immediately realized the tremendous opportunity we had to meet a huge need in Ethiopia for everything from surgical scissors, needle holders, retractors, forceps and chisels, to basic sutures."
