### Marinus (Dick) Koning February 10, 1946 - January 7, 2023

Dick was born in the eastern Dutch town of Oosterbeek shortly after the Second World War. Inspired by his parents' motto, "it's only worth doing if it serves someone else", he and his twin Jan, went to medical school at the Free University of Amsterdam. Next, Dick headed to the Bronx in New York for a sixyear surgical residency at Albert Einstein Medical School.

Dick met his wife, Patricia O'Neill, in Asia which began a long and wonderful relationship lasting 46 years. From 1978 to 2008, Dick practiced as a general, laparoscopic and bariatric surgeon in Redmond and Bend, Oregon.

When Dick first visited Ethiopia in 2009, he realized the extent of the neural tube defect crisis and decided to spend his retirement years advocating for children affected by this birth defect.

Thanks to his efforts and the community he built around him, more than 11,000 babies have received surgery to date, many surgeons have been trained, awareness for this condition has dramatically increased and a way to prevention has been paved.

Brain cancer took Dick from us way too early. We miss his loving kindness, his drive to serve, his mischievous sense of humor, and the way he would light up when he saw you. His constant determination to push boundaries and his deep generosity will continue to inspire us. He helped us realize what is possible, and what one caring person can achieve for others. He was the real deal.

## 2009


- ReachAnother Foundation is born with the intention to fund surgeries and, for the first time, give hope to children affected by neural tube defects.
- Dick and his wife, Patricia, spend months in Ethiopia exploring opportunities to help.

## 2023

- Passing of our founder, Dr. Dick Koning.
- Dick receives lifetime achievement awards from the American Association of Neurological Surgeons and the Spina Bifida Association.
- Start of a 3-year collaboration with Rotary to give folic acid to Ethiopian women to prevent multiple neural tube defect pregnancies.
- The WHO passes a resolution to accelerate food fortification to prevent neural tube defects.
- The Leona M. and Harry B. Helmsley Charitable Trust partners with ReachAnother to fund the first state of the art pediatric neurosurgery center as well as expand existing programs.
- July 1st, folic acid fortified flour becomes mandatory in Ethiopia. Only 20% of the population consumes flour products.
- ReachAnother Ethiopia team grows to 4 full-time staff.

# Strategic goals: 2023-2026



### PREVENTION

Work with partners to prevent neural tube defects by advocating for primary prevention through food fortification with folic acid and by implementing secondary prevention programs to give mothers folic acid tablets to avert multiple NTD pregnancies.



### TREATMENT

Improve access and quality of surgical care across our 8 Centers of Excellence partner hospitals. Our focus includes providing surgeries, training medical professionals, donating critical equipment, and fostering close partnerships with hospitals, Ministry of



### AFTERCARE

Ensure continuous access to aftercare services for children post-treatment through multidisciplinary teams. Our focus includes patient-centered care, self-catheterization training, SBH courses for health professionals, and pediatric physiotherapy expansion, enhancing quality of life and survival.

**3,000** parent handbooks distributed.

**2,900** patient information recorded in specialized database for research and evidence-based decision making.

**6,000** mothers attended a health education session to create awareness about folic acid supplementation and prevention strategies.

**2,500** mothers prescribed folic acid supplementation.


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260 types of equipment worth over \$1.1 million donated and distributed to 11 partner hospitals.
